- We start this month morning studies in **Galatians** whose message changed one man's life so profoundly that he ended up changing history around the world – that man's name was Martin Luther. **Galatians** has even been known as "Luther's Book".
- For our Home Group studies we're going to consider **The Tabernacle** that God gave to Moses in the wilderness and which speaks in a thousand ways of God and how we can acceptably draw near to Him.

Note: October 31st is the official **500th Anniversary of Martin Luther** nailing his 95 theses to the church door in Wittenberg which is considered the official start of what we now call the Protestant Reformation.
